Please read the updated dress code policies. Our staff at MHS will implement these board-adopted policies to follow on campus.

Regulations Policy

Placement on the LOP List

All MHS students can access their LOP status by using the QR code provided. If you find your student ID on this list, please contact your counselor to determine how you might gain back privileged status. The principal may place a student on the LOP list if, within 30 calendar days prior to the day of the event, the student has:

- A live GPA below 2.0 (not cumulative)
- Four (4) or more full day or single period unexcused absences
- Fifteen (15) or more cumulative (total for all periods) tardies
- Unpaid fees/fines
- Been suspended or recommended for expulsion
- **Privileged Activities -** Privileged activities include, but are not limited to:
- Graduation ceremony and senior activities
- Off-campus lunch privileges (11th & 12th grade only with parent permission) Dances
- Athletic events
- Recreational or reward field trips
- Rallies, fundraising events or activities, or other designated activities

- If your child is struggling with any of their classes, they can attend the After School Program to get FREE tutoring! No application is needed. Just have them stop by the library after school.
- There are also Tutor.com resources available free to students, which can be accessed through their <u>Clever</u> account.
- Encourage your student to stay organized by:
 - Using a calendar
 - Writing down all assignments for each class each day
 - Keeping track of deadlines
 - Communicating with teachers with any questions they may have
 - Checking their emails daily: There is a lot of communication being sent via email and it can be difficult to keep track of everything.
 - Making an appointment with their counselor when needed. Students are encouraged to make appointments using our new process. See VIDEO.


Schedules Changes: Counselors are in the process of leveling overloaded classes. Therefore, some class schedule changes may still be happening.

This chart represents the major and minor referrals for the first three weeks of school. As shared with staff this week, of the 189 minor referrals, 90 were for dress code, 30 were for technology violations, and over half of the minor referrals were from our freshman students. We are working diligently to consistently hold to our student/parent handbook and create a safe and effective learning environment for all students. This means, we are asking students to follow the dress code as outlined in the Handbook (English or Spanish) and to put away their cell phones during class time. Teachers are working collaboratively to create engaging and relevant lessons for students and our PRIDE team is being innovative about how they reward positive behavior (ask your students about Minga points) and how we support EACH student when they are struggling. We welcome your support in this endeavor and we would like to invite you into the conversation.
