The month of February has now ended and moving ahead into the month of March means the Spring Season of Sport is in full throttle!!! But, before we jump into spring let's highlight some of our winter athletic programs and their recent end-of-the-season accomplishments.

Coyote Wrestling had a very successful season with both boys and girls programs. Coyote Wrestling finished in 2nd place in CMAC League Standing!! Afterward, both programs then traveled to the respected CIF Division II tourney and came away with some outstanding performances!!!

For the girl's teams, who travel to Morro Bay, Mars Mujica, Zuelyma Sanchez-Vasquez, and Judith
 Martinez all came away with some ultra-tough victories and qualified for the Masters Tourney. Mujica had one of her best performances of the year, upsetting the \#2 seed in her weight class to finish in 3rd place overall. Her teammate Sanchez-Vasquez finished in 5th place and Martinez rounded it out with a 10th place finish. At the Masters Tourney, the competition was stiff but Mujica and Sanchez-Vasquez displayed heart and determination to complete their season and came away just short of qualifying for the State Tourney!!

For the boys program, the Coyotes came home from Redwood High School with an overall 4th place team finish while placing (5)individual wrestlers in the semifinal matches with automatic bids for the Masters. Junior Isaaiah Beas was the big winner of the program bringing home another heavyweight championship to join last year's winner and teammate Senior Vincente Rodriguez!!

At the Masters tourney, it was again Beas and teammate 11th grader Cameron Sibler, who both qualified for the State Tourney in Bakersfield. Although we wished both would have crossed the State's stage at the end, we are extremely PROUD of their individual and team accomplishments this season!!
(FUN FACT: Madera High School is the only high school in the State of California to send a wrestling qualifier to every State Wrestling Championship... 51 years and counting!! )


Another highlight from winter sports was both the Coyote Boys and Lady Coyotes Girls Basketball programs. The CMAC is a daunting task for any basketball program and our programs took some bumps and bruises along the way but they always demonstrated COYOTE PRIDE in every game!! Both qualified for Section Playoffs and took their talents on the road. The boys traveled to Immanuel and the girls traveled to Reedley and though their seasons did not end the way they envisioned their futures will lead to more promise in the seasons ahead.
